## "PRACTICAL STEPS FOR WINNING AT WORK"

1. Get a *new* job...

**Key:** Not a different one, but a different way of looking at the one you now have...before you change your job — change your attitude.

2. Go to work for a *new* boss...

**Key:** same job but a different reason for working. The new boss is God and every day your desire is to please Him.

3. Stop working for a living.

**Key:** We were never to work for a living. We ask the question, "what do you do for a living?" It's an irrelevant, distorting question. Our living is Jesus Christ. The Apostle Paul didn't say, "For me, to live is to be a tentmaker." Rather, he said, "For me to live is Christ." When Jesus Christ becomes the Lord of our life, the very meaning of our existence, then we become free to do our jobs and to do them well, to the glory of God, but not as the essential purpose of our being. A surrender of our lives to Jesus Christ gives us perspective on our work. It gives us power to work hard and gives us priorities in which to place work

where it belongs as a part of a whole life....

4. Find a *new* company.

**Key:** "Not a new organization, but a company of believers with whom you can meet consistently to talk about what it might mean to be faithful obedient to Jesus Christ on your job.
